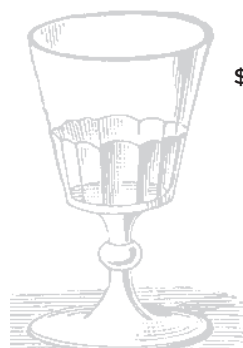

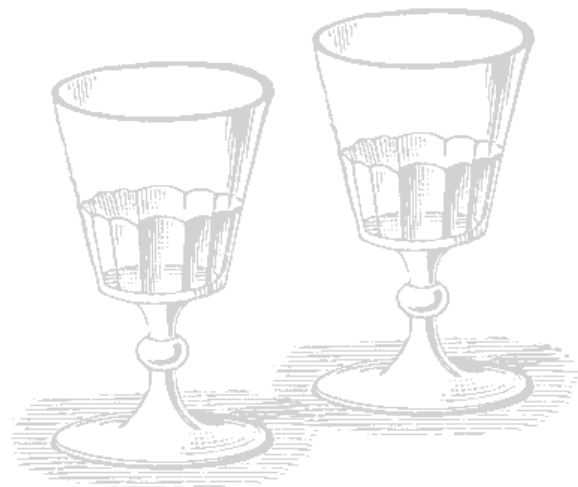

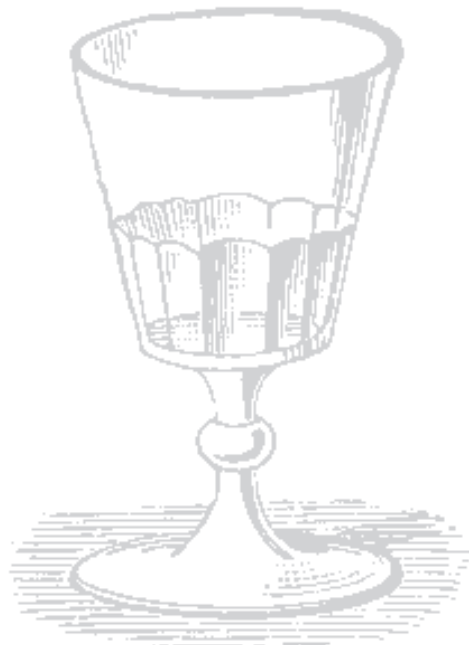

An aromatic, firm and very well-structured Right Bank Bordeaux. **\$68**

Kongsgaard Cabernet Sauvignon Napa Valley 2008

"Look for graphite, cedar, and violets in the aroma, and enjoy the luscious and powerful flavors." **\$275**

Tenuta San Guido Sassicaia Cabernet Sauvignon 2006

Possibly the greatest Tuscan vintage in recent history. A perfect balance of ripeness, acidity, and tannin. Leather, tobacco, and a finish that goes on for days. **\$375**

SYRAH/CÔTES-DU-RHONE/SHIRAZ/GRENACHE/PETITE SIRAH

Box Car Syrah 2008

Smoked bacon, wild blackberries and lilac on the nose with a strong satin finish. **\$40**

Cimicky "Trumps" Shiraz 2008

Clear, focused and detailed, delivering a juicy mouthful of plum, berry and tobacco flavors, hinting at clove and nutmeg as the finish lingers effortlessly. **\$46**

Oren Swift Cellars Abstract 2009

A blend of Grenache, Petite Sirah and Syrah, the wine has tons of weight, with layers of ripe cherry and strawberries. **\$52**

Vignalta, Agno Tinto Petite Syrah 2006

A blend of Petite Syrah, Marzemino and other local grapes. Conveys a gunmetal aspect with a very long, deep finish. **\$58**

Le Mes de Collines Gigondas Syrah 2007

Red fruits, especially strawberries, a little spice and some greenness. **\$61**

Domaine de la Biscarelle, Châteauneuf-du-Pape 2009

Aromas of sweet black cherry and black currant fruit along with hints of roasted herbs and forest floor emerge from this elegant, medium to full-bodied wine. **\$92**

Pax/Donelan Kobler Family Vineyard Syrah 2007, 2008

One of Pax's Russian River Valley offerings, the Kobler Single Vineyard is modeled after Cote-Rotie wines, with about 10% viognier mixed into the syrah to lift and lighten it. This is a rustic wine with a flourish of florals and minerals, and white pepper with olive tapenade on the finish. A great example of the Russian River's interpretation of the Northern Rhone. **\$110**

Pax/Donelan Cuvee Moriah Syrah 2004, 2006, 2008

Pax's Châteauneuf-du-Pape blend offers ripe berry and dried flowers in a very fresh front-palate, with minerality and supple tannins on the finish. **\$120**

Pax/Donelan Cuvee Christine Syrah 2004, 2006, 2007, 2008

A bulkier, more structured blend of 100% syrah, with a complex minerality and a depth of cedar to support the dried berry and spice typical of these North Coast grapes. **\$130**

Pax Cuvee Keltie Syrah 2006

The wine is characterized by a blissful mix of cardamom, roasted rosemary, and smoked cherries, built around firm acidity and tannins. Blended from exceptional barrels selected from several vineyards throughout Sonoma County. **\$180**

Betts and Scholl Hermitage Rouge 2005

A private label Hermitage made in collaboration with the Chave family. **\$105**

Failla Estate Vineyard Syrah 2008

Aromas of blueberry, black cherry and smoked meats with hints of violet and granite. **\$120**

Paul Jaboulet “La Chapelle” Hermitage Syrah 1996

Very round and supple, with orange rind and some earthy funk, followed through with spice and a delicate toastiness. **\$180**

Cayuse Syrah Armada Vineyard 2007

Flavors of dark fruits, kalamata olives, crushed stones and cracked pepper.. **\$225**

Kongsgaard Syrah Napa Valley 2008

“Harvested with mature, silky tannins, the wine is femrneted and macerated in 120-gallon puncheons for full extraction of the white pepper, violets, and dark chocolate character typical of the noble syrah.” **\$275**

La Landonne Cote-Rotie Syrah 1996

Tart berry, mineral palate with great depth and an exceptionally long finish. **\$300**

Sine Qua Non “On Your Toes” Syrah 2001

Black as night and exploding with creme de cassis and herbacious floral notes, this opulently textured Syrah is, like all Sine Qua Non wines, approaching New World perfection. **\$1900**



ZINFANDEL / PRIMITIVO

Matane Primitivo 2008

Muted nose. Bright berry fruit bomb. **\$31**

Coturri Sandocino Zinfandel NV

Dark, very complex, earthy wine with overtones of ripe strawberries and new leather in the aroma, an almost sweet mid-palate and fine textured tannins in the finish. **\$42**

Fritz Dry Creek Zinfandel 2006

A wine that is rich in color with aromas of blackberries, dried cranberries, licorice, spices, and subtle hints of violet. **\$45**

Sineann Old Vine Zinfandel 2009

"Huge" and "lush" are understatements. The oldest Zinfandel-producing vineyard in the Pacific northwest. **\$86**

Turley Contra Costa County Zinfandel 2008

Dried cherry, licorice root, dark chocolate and dried flowers. Head spinning alcohol, but a fantastic showcase for the rich, ripe old vine fruit. **\$110**

SANGIOVESE / TEMPRANILLO / NEBBIOLO

Intesa Villa Buonasera Sangiovese 2006

Refined, fruity with mulberries, coffee and toasted almond. Lots of crushed berry and cherry character. Medium- to full-bodied, with fine tannins. **\$49**

Renato Ratti Nebbiolo 2008

Predominantly cherries and red fruit with a hint of red licorice & herbs. Soft tannins and a bright finish. **\$51**

Bacio Divino "Pazzo" Sangiovese 2007

Lots of roasted herb, pepper, spice, and red and black fruit notes **\$69**

Gattera E Luciani Barolo Nebbiolo 2004

Rose and anise aromatics and deep flavors of cherry, orange peel and subtle green herb tones. **\$74**

Pio Cesare Barolo 2006

Extremely attractive aromas of blackberry, fresh mushroom and mahogany. Full-bodied, with lovely fruit, soft tannins and a long finish. **\$133**

JEAN-LOUIS CHAVE: SELECTIONS FROM THE NORTHERN RHONE

Jean-Louis Chave established his family's house on the Right Bank of the Rhone River in 1481. Every generation since then, from father to son, has grown wine on the slopes of Hermitage Hill and, later, within the larger fields of St. Joseph. Chave's Hermitage, with over 500 years of heritage behind it, is the best wine of its appellation and one of the best wines in the world.

Kermit Lynch, in *Adventures on the Wine Route*, described current patriarch Gerard Chave's house:

"There is a moral force behind Gerard Chave's respect for tradition and tireless search for quality. Here is a man who comprehends the heritage left behind in those mountainsides, one after another along the Rhone River, carved and sculpted and planted over the centuries in order to produce an annual flowering and fruition and finally a thing of liquid beauty. Chave is capable of communicating the responsibility that heritage imposes, and he does it not like a preacher handing down commandments but with a questioning mind, the smile of a man who loves a good joke, and a contagious joie de vivre. On top of all that, it is not easy to name a finer winemaker. Whatever qualities we might include in a listing of what makes a wine great, they all seem present at once in a glass of Chave Hermitage."

The Greenhouse Tavern proudly offers highly allocated selections from the Chave house, including both Hermitage Rouge and Blanc, and St. Joseph Estate.

J.L. Chave Hermitage Rouge 2007: A bottle intended to be opened very young or very old. 2007 saw many lesser Rhone winemakers produce diluted, underwhelming wines. Not so for Chave, whose growing and blending techniques call only for the very best grapes from their tiny vineyards. A high acidity and muscular tannins fill out Chave's trademark structure. Both floral and mineralic, and filled with dark fruit like the best Syrahs.

Hermitage Blanc 2007: A bright, youthful wine bursting with nectarines, white peach, orange zest and anise. Pepper and something approaching Yellow Chartreuse contribute to richness and subtle minerality.

Hermitage Rouge 2002: The 2002 Vintage is right in the best part of its life right now. Fig, cocoa, and dried currants followed by game, toasty ripe fruits, and black stone.

Hermitage Blanc 2002: White fruit and the honeysuckle quality typical in Chave Hermitage Blanc. Very aromatic, with a waxy earthiness.

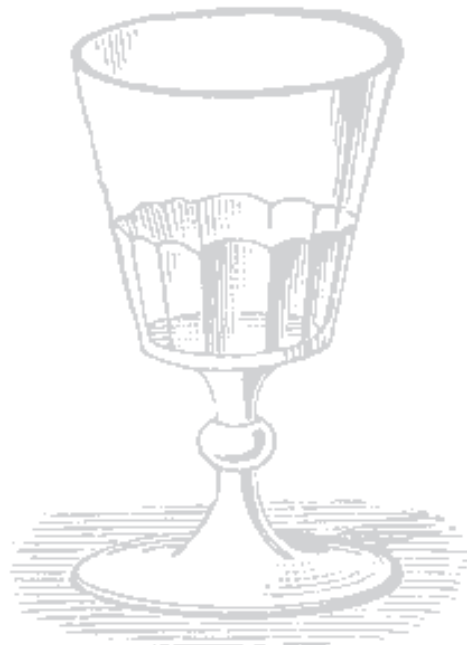
Crozes-Hermitage Rouge "Silene" 2007: 100% organically grown in only the hillside vineyards of the Crozes-Hermitage appellation. Very bright, very fresh, with plum and cherry backed by a flowery burst and a finish of iron.

St. Joseph Estate 2004, 2006, 2007: The 2004 is prime for drinking, with notes of blackberry, currant, toast, and spring flowers. A great wine to pop and pour. The 2006 is silkier and smells of violet, cassis, and iron. The structure is seamlessly integrated, with a finish of lush cherries. The 2007 is riper, more sensual, and far more peppery. Olive tapenade, baking spice, and candied floral notes finish.

St. Joseph "Offerus" 2006: Iron and tobacco weave through bright crushed cherry and lavender. Long, spicy, and pure.

Cotes-du-Rhone "Mon Coeur" 2007: A negociant selection from the Southern Rhone, "Mon Coeur" has the characteristic structure and richness of Chave wines, along with the bright fruit, herbs, and supple tannins typical of a more grenache-heavy wine.

SINGLE MALT SCOTCH

The Balvenie - Speyside

William Grant quit his job as the book-keeper of Mortlach Distillery in 1886 and bought a field under Balvenie Castle in Dufftown, where he converted the Balvenie New House Mansion into a distillery. The first barrel of The Balvenie was distilled there on May 1st, 1893.

Balvenie 12 "DoubleWood"

Transferred in the midst of its maturation from a traditional oak whisky cask to a "first-fill" reused Sherry barrel, the Balvenie DoubleWood combines the warming honey and vanilla of a typical Speyside malt with the nutty spice and dried fruit of Oloroso sherry.

Balvenie 15 "Single Barrel"

A single distillation ages in a single oak whisky barrel for 15 years before being batched into 350 hand-numbered bottles. Dry oak is the heaviest influence on this whisky, imparting to it vanilla, honey, dry heather and a subtle woodiness. Those extra few years lend increased complexity and a long, liquorice-tinged finish.

Balvenie 21 "PortWood"

After being finished for less than a year in 30-year-old Port barrels (or "pipes"), Balvenie PortWood takes on a beautifully silky texture to match the ripe raisin and fruit tones which overlay the signature honeyed spice of younger Balvenies.

Glenmorangie - Highland

The Sixteen Men of Tain, the collective name of the Glenmorangie Distillery, are responsible for some of the most elegant whiskies in the world. Founded in 1843 and producing whisky sporadically ever since, Glenmorangie has come to define the modern Highland malt.

Glenmorangie Lasanta

Finished in Oloroso Sherry casks after ten years in American bourbon barrels, Lasanta is a delightful play of brulee creaminess, chocolate covered raisins, and spiced orange. Lush body and a long finish.

Glenmorangie Quinta Ruban

Taken from the same ex-bourbon casks and instead transferred to Ruby Port pipes, Quinta Ruban is non-chill-filtered to retain its velvety feel, and imbued with chocolate, mint, and nutmeg give way to a long, lingering finish. A beautiful dessert whiskey.

Glenmorangie 18 "Extremely Rare"

A Scotch drinker's Scotch. This is a deeply complex and rich whisky, containing a whole cupboard's worth of spice and peppery maltiness, with a seemingly endless finish of chocolate malt and subtle smoke.

Bruichladdich - Islay

Built in 1881 by the Harvery brothers and run consistently till it was mothballed in 1994, then reopened in 2000 with Master Distiller Jim McEwan at the helm. Since then, Bruichladdich has produced beautiful special edition whiskies.

Bruichladdich "Rocks"

McEwan distilled "Rocks" to be Bruichladdich's most accessible but original whisky. Beyond initial flavors of red fruit, "Rocks" opens up to sea air. A great cheese whisky.

Bunnahabhain - Islay

Situated on the northeast tip, overlooking the Sound of Islay and tucked neatly into its rocky terrain to protect it from harsh sea winds, Bunnahabhain has been producing one of Islay's mildest malts since 1881.

Bunnahabhain 12

Restrained smoke complements a mild sweetness, and finishes in a chewy, meaty textural experience. A tremendous whisky to pair with food.

SINGLE MALT SCOTCH CONTINUED

Talisker - Island

"The king o' drinks, as I conceive it, Talisker, Isla, or Glenlivet." –Robert Louis Stevenson, *The Scotsman's Return from Abroad*, 1887

The Brothers MacAskill built Talisker Distillery in 1830, and it remains to this day the only distillery on the Isle of Skye.

Talisker 10

Talisker's water, from Cnoc nan Speireag (Hawk Hill), flows through a peat bog, and lends to its 10-year-old bottling a refined saltiness which is distinctive to Talisker. Dry, almost sour, with a syrupy texture and a lingering pepperiness.

Oban - Highland

Having only two pot stills, Oban is one of the smallest distilleries in Scotland. Built before the town that shares its name in 1794, its whiskies fall somewhere between the dry, smoky style of the Scottish islands and the lighter, sweeter malts of the Highlands.

Oban 14

Oban is made using only the finest barley, malted to the distillery's own particular specification. Partly germinated barley is gently dried in a kiln where a light peat smoke gives the malt a distinctive character and taste. The result is the smoky, malty dryness in the flavour and finish of Oban.

Lagavulin - Islay

The distillery of Lagavulin officially dates from 1816, when John Jonston and Archibald Campbell constructed two distilleries on the site. One of them became Lagavulin, taking over the other—which one is not exactly known.

Lagavulin 16

A much sought-after single malt with the massive peat-smoke that's typical of southern Islay - but also offering a dryness that turns it into a truly interesting dram.
